



### LOOKING AROUND REALLY PAYS OFF

I paint - but when not at the easel or dipping into the paint box, I keep a weather eye open for second-hand trade shops, and for garage sales that seem to pop up everywhere in summer. Now why do I do this? Well, let me give you five good examples that have occurred this year to date:

- #1. I dropped into an old house garage sale a few weeks ago, and there it was...a small, original painting by Glen Loates! Framed and all. It cost me \$2.00 for this small gem with a retail value modestly approaching many, many dollars.
- #2. At another sale, I picked up a framed quarter sheet watercolour of some lake in Ontario. It was quite pretty really, but I was after the frame which was only \$4.00. (Actually, I got it for \$3.) Last week I opened the back and (Lo and Behold!) the painting portion was simply the cover of a 6 page greeting card, custom painted. Inside, on the other 5 pages, were the signatures of almost all the members of the Ontario Legislature signed with greetings from Premier John Robarts, his Cabinet, and all the MP's that were in the legislature during his time in office in the 1970's. I'm gonna keep this treasure for myself opinions from those who know say it's one of a kind and historically valuable.
- #3. I passed by a small yet pleasing oil painting of the river dam at Athabasca. I knew it was good, but only discovered it was a Grebzy later on. Anton Grebzy was a Hungarian immigrant who worked for Hydro years back. He was also a master painter. One day, the Hydro Chairman, Duncan, happened to drive by as Grebzy was painting in a field close to the generating station. Duncan stopped, and was so impressed that he dismissed old Master Grebzy from his menial job and appointed him the official Hydro painter. That painting was worth a pile of change, indeed.
- #4. A while back, I needed a frame and saw one in a Toronto Goodwill or suchlike store. Although the frame was rather ornate, I bought it. Later, I opened up the back and...Goodness! There was over \$500 wedged into the back all old King George 50's, 20's, and 10's. Pristine and uncirculated. Mint condition. A coin dealer I know paid me many times the face value of this trove of collector cash. Yum! Yum!
- #5. Just this afternoon I saw, and was delighted to obtain, an extremely ornate Victorian 3-D metal frame. It simply breathed antiquity perhaps having spent its past on the top of some old

Victorian piano. My problem now is to paint something suitable to go into that wonderful frame. The frame alone is worth quite a bit.

And, on top of these rarer finds, garage sales are chock-a-block filled with art - most nicely matted and ready to use. Simply remove the old print and pop your watercolour into the inviting space...sure cuts costs and overheads. Most pick-up frames only cost a few dollars, compared to the \$100 or more charged by framers.

And, oh yes! Last year I found a fully complete and unused oil painting set of 52 colours, liquids, brushes and all, neatly nestled in a velvet padded, polished mahogany case. All unused! I looked up similar stuff on the Internet and it's worth a bundle.

So happy hunting! Drop into those secondhand shops and park at those garage sales. You'll be quite surprised at what the good folk ( or their millennially modern grandchildren) throw away. And yes - your wallet will get weightier along this happy discovery trail.



Art Cunanan was in France and Spain this summer conducting a workshop.






